The new Chair, who will take up post in early 2020, will lead the Governing Council in shaping the nature and strategy of the University, supporting and holding to account the Executive, and ensuring the effective governance and scrutiny of all activity. He or she will also play an important and visible role in University life, attending functions and events and developing strong relationships with the RAU community, external stakeholders and funders.

It is expected that the Chair will offer a relevant executive and non-executive track record in organisations of comparable scale and complexity, ideally in areas such as agri-business, land management, animal health, food production and/or related supply chains. He or she should be a powerful and compelling advocate for the RAU, with broad-based national and/or international networks. Financial and commercial acumen is essential, as is empathy with higher education and a commitment to the RAU's mission. Prior experience of education management or governance is, however, not a prerequisite.
